Date: WWII

Physical Description: Diameter 34.1 cm Hand painted ceramic plate

Physical Characteristics: Hand painted plate displays location names and scenes of significance No. 14 Canadian General Hospital, RCAMC, from mobilization Westmount, Quebec in 1940 to Perugia Italy in 1944. Plate appears to have been broken and repaired

Provenance: Artist Major Jules Gosselin ca June 1944

Bag Medical, Shell Dressings

Date: WWII +

Physical Description: Small canvas bag

Physical Characteristics: Marked with Red Cross and labled "Shell Dressings

Provenance: Used by frontline Medical Assistants.



Surgical Instrumen Roll

Date: WWI

Physical Description: Canvas roll containing surgical instruments.

Physical Characteristics: Canvas case with an assortment of stainless-steel surgical instruments, including Magill and artery forceps, tweezers and retractors

Provenance: Unknown





Ceramic Bed/Foot Warmer.

Date circa WWI

Physical Description: As pictured

Physical Characteristics: Tan and brown ceramic container with screw-on stopper on top, handle on one end.

Provenance: Used as a bed or foot warmer



Medical Bag

Date: Pre WWI

Physical Description: Canvas bag with shoulder strap and marked AMC¹ Canada

Physical Characteristics: Contains original Supplies

Provenance: Possibly use during South Africa Campaign

First Aid Kit - General Purpose

Date:1961-70

Physical Description: First Aid Kit in canvas pouch

Physical Characteristics: Canvas bag containing an assortment of basic first aid supplies. Gromets provided to attach to vehicle

Provenance: Carried in military vehicles

Bandage Roller

Date: ca 1870 - 1900

Physical Description: Antique bandage roller as pictured

Physical Characteristics: Basic metal instrument with wooden handle and clamps to secure to a rigid surface

Provenance: Used by physicians, nurses and orderlies



Skinfold Calipers

Date: ca WWII

Physical Description: Storage box and skinfold calipers

Physical Characteristics: Lined wooden storage box and stainless steel calipers with gauge

Provenance: Used by physicians for the measurement of skinfold thickness and the estimation of total body fat

Field Dental Kit

Date: ca WWI

Physical Description: Black wooden, top and front opening, case.

Physical Characteristics: Two folding and two slide-out instrument trays; and three drawers. Contents include an array of dental instruments, including picks, mirrors, extractors, etc.

Provenance: Used by dentists

US Army Medical Bag

Date: ca WWII+

Physical Description: Canvas bag with shoulder strap

Physical Characteristics: Marked with Red Cross labeled IV Bag



Intubation Set

Date: ca WWII

Physical Description: Cotton roll containing an assortment of intubation tubes

Physical Characteristics: Cotton wrap

Provenance: Used in the field by physicians to provide an airway for a patient



Wicker Medical Pannier

Date: WWII and WWII +

Physical Description: Wicker panier

Physical Characteristics: Wicker body with canvas cover and locking bar

Provenance: Used in the field by medical units for storage and transport of medical supplies



Whittaker Leg Traction Splint

Date: ca WWII

Physical Discription: As pictured

Physical Characteristics: Tan canvas and wood construction. Manufactured by Gurrock Ropes and Canvas Ltd Montreal. One person can apply in three minutes

Provenance: Used in as and where required.



Uniforms and Acessories



Date: ca WWI

Physical Description: Authentic Medical Officer's Great Coat

Physical Characteristics: Woolen coat with surgeon's cuff and dull cherry piping on epaulettes

Provenance: Worn by a CAMC officer during the winter



WWI CAMC NCO Uniform

Date: WWI

Physical Description: Authentic Canadian Army Service Dress. Jacket belt, jodhpurs, riding boots and cap with General Service badge

Physical Characteristics: Khaki wool jacket with: CAMC General Service buttons and collar dogs, brass "Canada" shoulder titles 4th Div patch, Sgt Major insignia (stripes & crown), Red Cross patch, three (3) service chevrons and two (2) medals; jodhpur; brown leather riding boots and Oliver belt;and khaki wool peaked cap.

Provenance: Uniform pictured was worn by Sgt Major Christopher Pamplin. Christopher (Chris) Pamplin, a member of 13 Field Ambulance (Predecessor to 11 Field Ambulance).



Other Ranks Patrol Dress

Date: ca 1919 - 1938

Physical Description: Authentic Other Ranks Patrol Dress tunic

Physical Characteristics:

Midnight blue serge tunic with similar material and colour trousers. with dull cherry lanyard and piping on epaulettes. RCAMC buttons and collar insignis.

Provenance: Worn by Other Ranks on parade or other ceremonial/formal as required

Battle Dress Blouse and Wedge Cap

Date: ca 1939 - 1945

Physical Description: Authentic Battle Dress Blouse with, and Field Service (Wedge) Cap,

Physical Characteristics: Waist length khaki wool blouse worn with similar material trousers, shirt, tie, putties and ankle boots. RCAMC cap badge, Captain cloth pips, shoulder flashes and lanyard

Provenance: Worn by all ranks as universal work dress





Officer's Mess Dress

Date: Circa 1919 - 1939

Physical Description: Authentic pre-WWII mess dress jacket and waistcoat

Physical Characteristics:

Midnight blue barathea jacket with dull cherry lapels and cuffs, RCAMC buttons and collar badges and embroidered rank insignia and a dull cherry waistcoat was worn with midnight blue trousers with a dull cherry stripe and black shoes/boots..Spurs were optional for senior officers.

Provenance: Worn for mess dinners and other formal evening functions



19th Century Nurse's Unifrom

Date: circa 1854-1885

Physical Description: Replica nurse's uniform as worn during the North West Campaign

Physical Characteristics: Full length long sleeved maroon cotton dress, white apron (waist to dress hemline) Red Cross sleeve band and traditional nursing school/hospital white cap.

Provenance: The nurse were civilian requested, by Col Darby Bergin from hospitals in Winnipeg and Toronto, to provide post operative and convalescent care for the wounded



Nursing Sisters' Service Dress

Date: circa 1889-1902

Physical Description: Replica service dress uniform

Physical Characteristics: Full-length two-piece khaki cotton uniform was worn with a straw hat with a red feather

Provenance: Worn by Canadian Army Nursing Services Nursing Sisters deployed to South Africa during the Boer War




Nursing Sister's Service Dress (Ward) Uniform



Physical Description: Replica Nursing Sisters Ward Dress

Physical Characteristics: Ankle length blue cotton jacket and skirt white bibbed apron (no pockets) was worn with a leather belt with a brass buckle, white veil and brown shoes

Provenance: Worn by CAMC Nursing Sisters working in hospitals and convalescent centres





Nursing Officers' Ward Dress

Date: 1970-1993

Physical Description: Authentic post unification nurses work dress

Physical Characteristics: White short sleeved one piece dress with CFMS buttons worn with white generic nurses cap and shoes. Rank insignia appeared on cap and shoulder epaulettes

Provenance: Worn by Nursing Officers in Canadian Forces hospitals and clinics.



Nursing Officers Operational Work Dress

Date: 2010 - present

Physical Description: Authentic CADPAT (Arid) uniform with Captain rank insignia, name tag "Nurse", Red Cross Brassard and ISF Patch (International Security Assistance Force) with a field hat and high top boots

Physical Characteristics: Loose fitting two-piece cotton

Provenance: Worn as work dress by nurses in Afghanistan and in other similar operational environments






